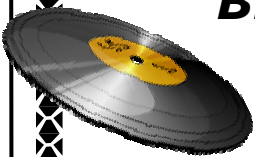
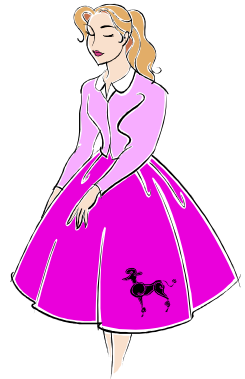

Wondering where we are in the interim/search process? Our website (www.stjohnsky.com, click 'Search for Our New Rector') has an interesting graphic to illustrate the process.

The transition tasks are almost accomplished with only a few things left to finish. The behind the scenes action is rapidly coming to a close. In the upcoming weeks and months there is a huge volume of work to do—all the purple boxes in the graphic! So those of us who have been itching to move forward in this process will soon have lots more information.

The Vestry will be working very hard on its tasks. Remember that anyone is welcome to come to our meetings—second Tuesday of the month.

The Diocesan office tells us that many clergy are calling them inquiring about various parish vacancies. The key point here is that almost all research is being done online! We are being assessed by possible candidates at this point exclusively on the basis of our website! We have a really great one, but check it out if you haven't and let us know if there is something missing or needing freshening up.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

One of my favorite English poets is George Herbert (1593-1633). Herbert was a parish priest who also had court connections to James I and his son Charles I, who eventually bestowed on him a parish with a substantial living. What seems to characterize the poets of this period is the profound expression of a simple faith that was looking for a middle way between Roman Catholicism and rising Puritanism. It is during this period that the idea of Anglicanism as the “three-legged stool” of faith, tradition, and reason was formulated. In any case, George Herbert is the author of several hymns featured in our hymnal. Hymn 382 is a setting of the poem “King of glory, king of peace” with an equally lovely tune by David Charles Walker. Pairing text and tune is not always an easy process. The poem “Let all the world in every corner sing” is set to two tunes at number 402 and 403. I am still waiting for a really good tune. Ralph Vaughn Williams composed a stirring setting in anthem format, but a good congregational setting is still wanting. One of Williams’ settings of Herbert’s poetry that has worked well congregationally is Hymn 487, “Come, my Way, my Truth, my Life.” This is truly a

sublime poem, which is actually titled, “The Call.” If anyone ever had any doubts, reading this poem can aid in restoring faith. An additional Herbert setting can be found at Hymn 592, “Teach my, my God and King.”

Our hymnal is not just something to pick up and sing from during corporate worship. It is also something to *read*. The texts found therein are intended to enliven and inspire, as well as to provide spiritual food for calm reflection. We are blessed to have such a hymnal, and we have an incredible banquet when combined with the Book of Common Prayer. If you don’t have these two books in your home, I encourage you to acquire them. I keep copies of them at home as well as in my desk at work. When life gets hectic, the expressions of faith really help to calm things down and restore perspective, and that’s something that the poetry particularly of George Herbert does for me.



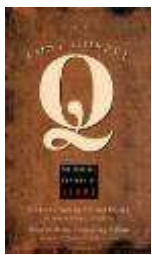
EfM to Begin in September

Education for Ministry, the four-year theological study program of the School of Theology at Sewanee covering the Bible, church history and theology, will reconvene in mid-September at St. John's. Scholars have theorized that perhaps there was a source to which they each referred, designed 'Q,' after the German word 'quelle' which means 'source.' This book investigates this theory.

Speaking of History . . .

We didn't always have a Communion service followed by breakfast. In fact, it came about during the 50's and evolved into today's 9 o'clock. Once there was only Morning Prayer at 11 and Communion once a month. Some "new" parishioners from another diocese brought a group of young families together to say Morning Prayer on their own, but at an earlier hour. Coffee, cereal, and juice followed naturally; lots of coffee and much talk for the parents while the young ones went off to Sunday School. A new Rector arrived and immediately declared St. John's would celebrate full Communion at 9, later changed to 8:45 -- and the Wiggler's Mass, as it was known, began. The breakfast, however, remained as it was for a few more years, with an occasional plate of doughnuts to delight the children. Many a box of sugared cereal was sneaked into Sunday School classes, and on doughnut days the "sugar-high" took its toll on frazzled teachers! It took another Rector to decide that a full breakfast was needed, and he hired our much-loved and long standing helpers, George (who became Sexton) and Jessie Scarce, to staff the kitchen Sunday mornings.

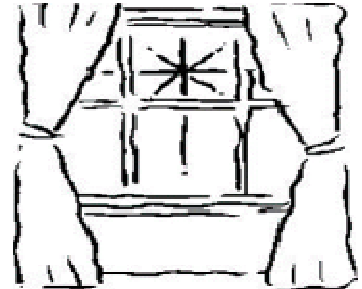
Looking Out My Window August 2010

What is the difference between change and transition? I have found one helpful answer in the work of William Bridges. He has written several books on this topic, but I still prefer the first one, *Transitions: Making Sense of Life's Changes* (Addison-Wesley, 1980). He illustrates the difference in this way. If you moved to a new place, the geographical shift would be the change; the stresses and difficulties and excitement would be the transition, or your responses to the change.

Every transition, according to Bridges begins with *an ending*. The change means something new, but the transition begins with separating from the old. Even a "good" change, like the birth of a first child, begins with the ending of the childless phase of life. Before the *new beginning* can happen, Bridges says there is a middle phase, what he calls *neutral ground*. In that middle phase, the old reality has passed away but the new has not yet emerged or become obvious. The ending disconnects us from the previous reality and the neutral zone is what Bridges calls a "fallow time," a time when old patterns and habits give way to new possibilities.

It's easy to see why Bridges' work has become so helpful to clergy and churches experiencing the interim between permanent clergy. We're together in that neutral zone now as an interim rector and people. The new reality of your future will arise out of this time, but the new beginning does not coincide exactly with the calling of a new rector.

The new reality of St. John's future is not dependent on new clergy being called. Your story is larger than the individual clergy who have come and gone over the years. Rather, that new beginning will happen during this neutral zone time as a new vision, new energy, and new excitement arise out of the work of the interim period. People who may have gotten discouraged and been less involved will begin to get excited about the church's new vision and reinvolve themselves. People who have been slugging along and feeling tired will feel renewed energy around the vision and direction of the church.



Your involvement in each activity and event of the interim period is crucial, like the historical time line we'll do together on August 1. That renewed vision and energy will begin to arise in the collective heart of St. John's as we talk, pray, and dream together over the next several months.

I'm up for this. Are you? Right now, I need each one of you. St. John's needs you. And, you need the community. I love these lines from Bridges, "Chaos is the primal state of pure energy for every true new beginning."

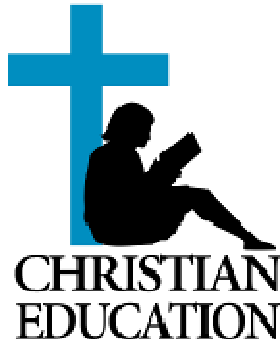

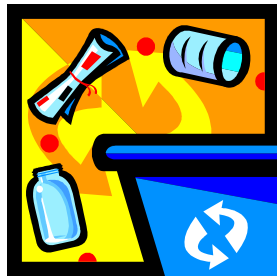
WATCH FOR THOSE BLUE BAGS!!
