Interim Process Update from Fr. David:

Holy Conversations

Thank you for your participation in the first two Holy Conversations. The attendance has been excellent. These conversations continue in December, with Holy Conversations numbers three and four.

Wednesday, December 1, 6 p.m. -

Holy Conversation #3: "When my safe place changes: looking across the bridge to God's future for..."

This session deals with how participants have experienced change in the past, particularly in their parish, before turning to visioning for the future, and having an opportunity to express wishes, hopes and dreams, and things they specifically and individually are willing to do to make those hopes and dreams come true.

Wednesday, December 8, 6 p.m. -

Holy Conversation #4: "The way I connect with God; the way others connect with God"

Utilizing The Rev. Urban T. Holmes's concept of four spiritualities--Head Spirituality, Heart Spirituality, Mystic Spirituality and Kingdom Spirituality, we will engage in exercises that clarify each participant's primary ways of connecting with God and how those differing spiritual experiences impact the life of the parish.

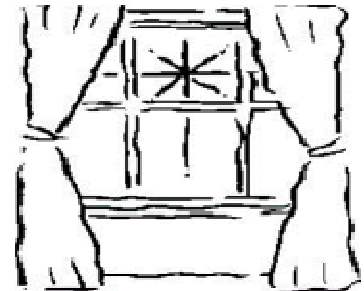


Looking Out My Window - December 2010

John Buchanan, a Presbyterian minister says of Advent: "One problem with appreciating Advent is that many people want to sing Christmas carols, not Advent hymns. I try to tell people about the tradition of waiting in the darkness, anticipating the light. But they say, 'It's too gloomy.' [John M. Buchanan, "Deepening Darkness," in *The Christian Century*, Vol. 123, No. 24, November 28, 2006, p. 3.]

Buchanan grew up in Pennsylvania in a Presbyterian tradition that did not celebrate Advent. My southern Louisiana Baptist tradition did not introduce me to the concept either, in spite of the dominant Roman Catholic influence in that bilingual culture. In seminary, when I first encountered the concept of the ecclesiastical year with its changing seasons, I found myself immediately attracted and intrigued.

The mad rush toward Christmas now begins before Thanksgiving. Black Friday has devolved into a mad frenzy of buying for a Christmas still a month away. Shoppers tool around in malls to secular and religious Christmas music. Meanwhile, on Sundays we are singing those gloomy Advent hymns. We also are delaying setting up Christmas trees and putting the baby Jesus into mangers and crèches until December 24. What gives?



For those in the catholic traditions (Episcopal, Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Orthodox), Christmas does not begin until Christmas Eve and continues until January 6, the Feast of Epiphany. Those are the twelve days of Christmas. Advent gives us ritual time to sit with the gloomy, delayed hopes of our lives. We can join with the prophets, who for centuries wrestled with the delayed promises of salvation for their people. We can join with John the Baptist, awaiting the arrival of that Savior. We can join with Mary and Joseph and await the birth of the child.

The interim period of St. John's experience involves something of an Advent hope. We are carrying on the mission of this parish while anticipating the arrival of a new rector. It's not like we're waiting passively; rather, we're seeking to become a stronger parish and seeking to understand more fully who we are that we might, under God, call the appropriate person.

We can resist the mad rush toward early Christmas and renew our trust in God's ability to keep those long delayed promises in our lives. We can appreciate the light of Christ's coming more fully from our position on the dark side of the approaching dawn. Then, on Christmas Eve, we can throw our weight into the celebration of Christ's coming and into praising God for the promises realized and the hopes already lived into.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

It is unbelievable to be at the end of 2010, though people tell me that it is a sign of age when years seem to go by with increasing speed. We have already started a new liturgical year with the arrival of Advent, and shortly we will be beginning yet another calendar year. All in all, it is a time of transitions. As we head into 2011, we begin the second decade of this century. Only a short time ago, we were worried about "Y2K" and what would happen to our computers. Well, not much as it turned out. We are also transitioning into a new chapter in the history of our church. A year ago, we said farewell to Fr. Alan Sutherland. Since that time, we have welcomed an interim rector, and a search committee is actively at work seeking the next permanent rector who will define a new chapter. In looking back over the course of the year, there have been many small changes that have made a big difference in how I do my work here. One has been the introduction of regular staff meetings, which have developed a greater sense of *cameraderie* along with the realization of just how interconnected we are. I have been challenged and stretched, particularly with the organizing of the Jazz Vespers, in which I learned something new.

The greatest agent of change, however, is the one whose birth we will be celebrating in just a few weeks. When Christ was born, only a few people realized the significance. In spite of various signs and miracles, many of which we celebrate during the coming Epiphany season, the gathering of the fol-

lowers of Jesus remained small, and was no different at the time of the crucifixion. One could say the real power of change manifested itself after Jesus was gone. A small sect grew to eventually become the dominant religion of the Roman world. A year ago, a chapter ended and some of us were not sure what would happen next or if the story of St. John's would really continue much in a meaningful way. But, we have begun a new chapter in which we have steadily grown, not just in a physical but also a spiritual way. We have experimented with some new music and new liturgy, and actually some of it not really all that new, but new to us, anyways. These things shape and change us for the better as we continue to show forth the power of Christ in our community.

Versailles Christmas Parade - Saturday, December 4

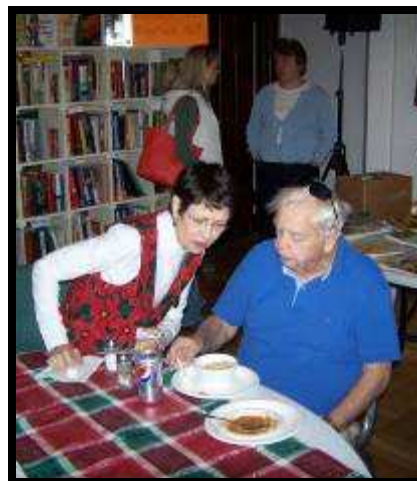
The children and youth are participating in the Versailles Christmas parade. If you haven't seen the parade before, the Kentucky State University band plays and it's a lot of fun!

2010 in Review from Sr. Warden Ann Richmond

St. John's has had an eventful year by anyone's measure. We have grown in resourcefulness and reliance on God.

On November 14, 2009, Fr. Sutherland announced to the Vestry that he was resigning to accept a call in Oklahoma. Christmas Eve was his last service. We began January 2010 without a Rector, no Interim in sight, no assistant Rector to be with us.

It was with sadness and uncertainty that the vestry began planning its course. After several liturgies and parties celebrating the Sutherlands and our time together, January came and we were on our own.

Immense thanks are due to our wonderful deacon Donna Barr who found us supply clergy for all services, who loved us, and cared for all of us pastorally and modeled for us the love of Christ. She was our only assigned clergy until May 2010!

We formed our committees in January and they stepped up with a level of energy and responsibility so essential without a rector.

A parishioner, Pat Martin, died in late December and left her house to St. John's. This necessitated lots of work and cleanup ably organized by Ann Sturm.

In February, in conjunction with our diocesan convention, St. John's was honored by the Presiding Bishop, the Most Reverend Katherine Jefferts Schori, who came on Sunday morning to celebrate Eucharist with us. A massive cleanup and spif up preceeded the visit.

Also in February the Vestry extended a call to Fr. David Perkins, to come and be our Interim Rector. He accepted but was not able to be with us until May 2.

Holy Week was presided over by Fr. Jay Pierce who celebrated an amazing 15 of the 16 services during Holy Week. We are enormously grateful for his help and care during that time.

Fr. Perkins first sermon for us was the first Sunday in May.

By July, the work of the interim period was far enough along that we were able to establish a schedule in conjunction with our Diocesan consultant for our self study and the development of our parish profile.

The Vestry chose option B for our search procedure, which should entail less expense and time than other options.

Attendance held reasonably steady even during our rectorless period.

It is now December and our Holy Conversations are under way and will be completed before Christmas.

We will begin building our parish profile and seeking our next permanent Rector.

Thanks be to God for every single one of you, my brothers and sisters in Christ. It has been a joy and a privilege to serve you this year.
