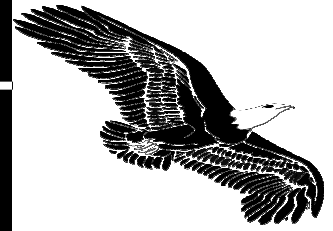

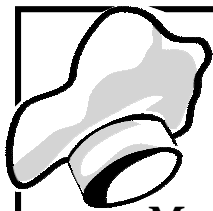

From the Senior Warden, Ann Richmond

This is an exciting time in the life of St. John's! Although we have said goodbye to our wonderful Rector, we are an energetic, loving, forward-looking community of faithful people. We will continue to grow in love and service with God's help.

I can't help but think about the contrast between who St. John's is now in January 2010 and who St. John's was in January 2004. It was a dark and cold time that January 2004 when about 40 of us were left at St. John's, the rest having gone to form their own church in part over the Episcopal Church's position on the inclusion of gay and lesbian people. But we were far from despairing! We had a very clear choice: inclusion or exclusion? Love or judgment? St. John's became very intentional about inclusion and love, about doing the work we saw needed around us, to welcome all people of whatever kind or condition to worship with us and be part of our community of faith.

As the years have passed, many people have come to be a part of St. John's. The remnant 40 have become hundreds. Our mailing list for this newsletter grows every month and is currently 352. People have come I think because they truly feel welcome. That is something we must be intentional about

every day. Welcome. That is why this year we have a Vestry assignment for Newcomers/Membership. Carol Filson will lead that ministry.

In this period without a Rector, as your Vestry searches for an Interim Rector, life at St. John's may feel a bit different. It may feel a bit empty. It is important that we think about the person next to us at worship or breakfast and ask ourselves if that person feels welcomed and loved and a part of the life of our parish. Next, ask yourself what you can do to be sure that that is so. Then do it.

I am honored to be your Senior Warden. I'll try to send weekly updates to the parish email list (If you aren't on it, email Elaine at memsecy@aol.com and she'll add you.), about how the search is going and other things. We all have a lot of work to do in our various ministries.

Everyone can help:

Love one another.

Say your prayers.

Pray for your Vestry, the search process, and our community of faith at St. John's.

Do you remember the first few moments in the motion picture, *An Officer and A Gentleman*? The cadets for Navy flight school were met by a Marine Drill Instructor whose intent was to belittle, denigrate, discourage and finally to fail as many as possible. He was loud, in your face and frightening. You could see the self-doubt and fear surface in the faces of the cadets.

My introduction into the Air Force pilot training program was very different. On the Sunday night before our classes began several of us were smoking outside the barracks—of course we were not to be outside.

Sleep was impossible. So, we made introductions and tried our hand at some humor--very bad jokes. Suddenly, the sound of footsteps on the gravel walkway stopped our little get-together. We panicked, but before we could flee into the dim light stepped a man in flight uniform, complete with shining boots, wings and unit patches. He was a Lieutenant Colonel. As we snapped to attention we offered a silent prayer: Oh, God. Please. Don't let them discharge me on the first night!

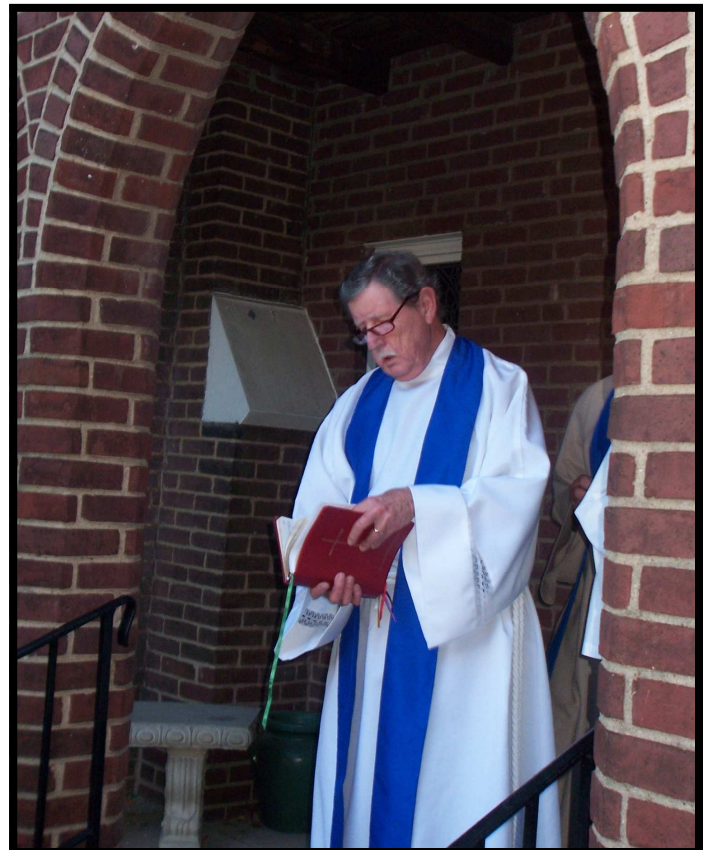
"Good evening gentlemen" he began. "I'll bet you're here to begin training tomorrow, aren't you?" We provided an awkward, "Yes, Sir." "As I remember my first night here," he continued, "it was sleepless and I experienced a little diarrhea too." A little nervous laughter from us provided a pause for the Colonel. "I'll put money on your first USAF dinner isn't sitting too well, is it?" He smiled as we agreed. Then he reached for a cigarette offered by a cadet. Our new friend—so designated because he wasn't hostile, produced a well-worn ZIPPO that burst into flame with the slightest thumb motion. "Gentlemen," he said, "everything, I repeat, everything you need to graduate from preflight you've already demonstrated you possess—intelligence, physical ability, coordination and emotional stability. The only person that will defeat you—is you." He took a hit on his cigarette, stood in silence and lis-

tened to our collective heart pounding, turned and walked back into the darkness. Without fail, every one of us remembered those words in the months and years ahead.

St. John's is experiencing an unexpected challenge. With Fr. Alan's departure we were shocked. We loved him and depended on his strength and leadership—not to mention the energy and devotion he lavished on us. He "loved" us, and to take the place of Alan we've set off on a process we're a little frightened by. It will require some time for the self-analysis, meetings and almost endless discussions of the attributes we believe are required of the person that is to help us in our journey of faith.

It's been helpful to me, and I hope for everyone at St. John's, to remember the words of that late night visitor, "Everything you need . . . you've already demonstrated you possess."






The First Monday of Each Month Finds St. John's Parishioners Serving and Delivering Community Dinners—Want to Help?

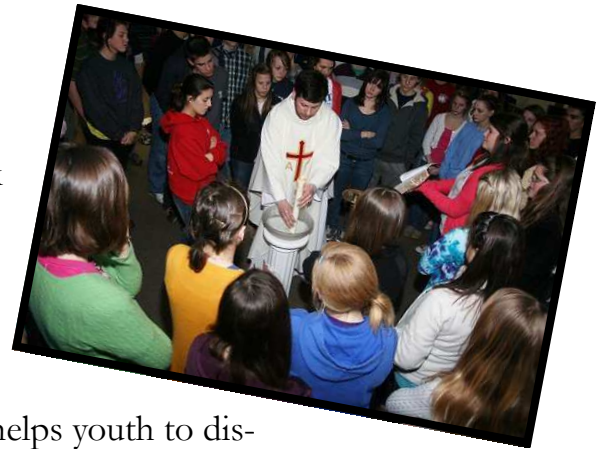

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

With the recent cold snap, I have received a lot of questions about the organ and all the noise it is making. A few years ago, I wrote an article about our organ, which I have named "Elsie." Elsie is about 113 years old now, and in spite of continuing to render consistent and faithful service, Elsie does occasionally show signs of age, especially during cold weather. Elsie is a mechanical action organ, which means that there are a lot of wooden parts that are carefully joined, but not necessarily glued, because some of them have to slide with one another. With the wind supply pulling in air from the outside, Elsie's inner parts dry out a little and contract. When that happens, air escapes around the sliding parts and the pipe valves and makes a whistling noise. We will just have to become accustomed to the fact that Elsie will sometimes make unflattering noises during church. We can be proud, however, that we have one of the oldest organs in the diocese that is still in its original location and in good condition.



February is going to be an active month in the musical life of St. John's. We will be continuing to showcase "new" hymns from *Wonder, Love & Praise* at the 9:00 service. In many church choirs, there always seems to be a post-Christmas malaise that sets in and lasts through the winter, but not here. Choral Evensong will be presented at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday,

February 14, as we celebrate the end of the Epiphany season with our last "Alleluias" until Easter and bridge into the Lenten season. I am also pleased to announce that the second Friends of Music concert of the season will take place at 7:00 p.m. on Friday, February 26, and will feature the **Tantalus Quartet**, which is an internationally known guitar ensemble. Admission will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for students. The Friends of Music concerts have turned out to be a unique form of outreach to our

community. These concerts have been well attended, and about three-fourths of the attendees are not members of our church. I am now getting suggestions for future events, as well as requests from artists to come perform here. We have a lot to look forward to that is exciting in the life of our church.

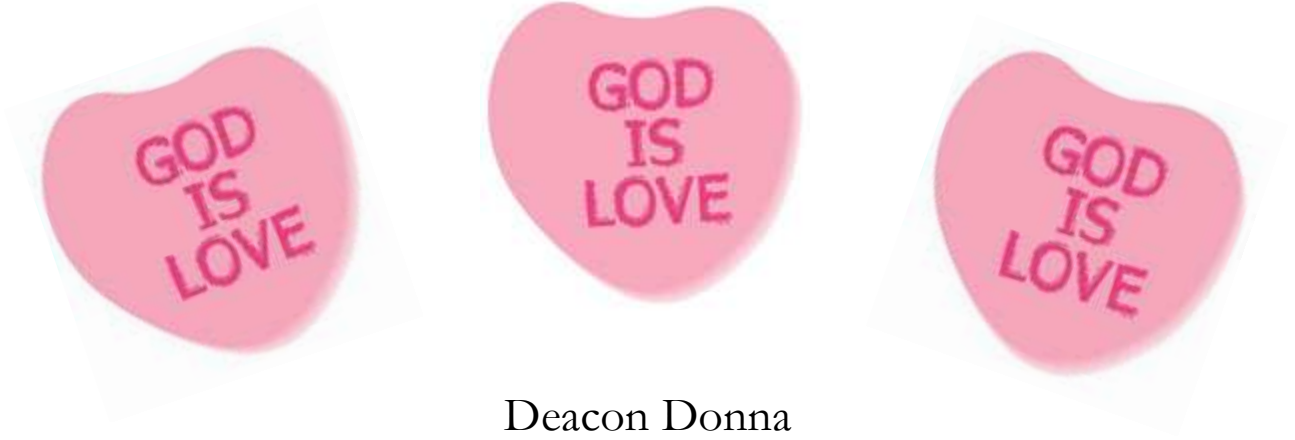

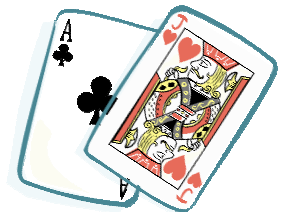

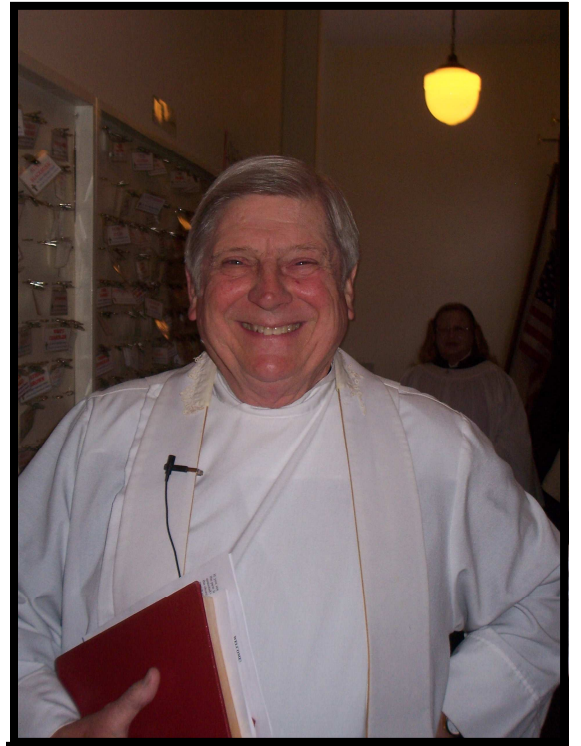
