David was born in Oakdale, Louisiana, on the edge of the Acadian, bilingual French/English culture of south Louisiana, the first-born son of Bill and Ruth. He grew up in a Baptist family and responded to a call to ministry during high school—paying for his senior ring with pulpit supply money.

He graduated from The University of Louisiana at Monroe with a BA in biology and from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary with a Masters and a Doctorate degree in New Testament studies. The interface between the Bible and literature always has fascinated him and he did extensive post-doctoral study in comparative literature at Emory University and at LSU. He found his way into the ordination process and did Anglican studies at The School of Theology at The University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. He is still pecking away on

a thesis for an STM in Anglican Studies. He has most recently served as start up priest and vicar at All Souls Episcopal Church, Atlee (Hanover County, north metro Richmond) since February 2002. All Souls is a new congregation that began public worship in November 2003 under the sponsorship of the churches of Region 11 of the Diocese of Virginia.

He has two 'awesome' children, Ben, who lives in Flagstaff, AZ with his wife, Jennifer and Katie Glaeser who lives in Georgia with her husband John and their two children Aeden and Jonas.

David finds life-giving energy in hiking, fly fishing, camping, cooking, reading, and writing. He 'dabbles' at writing poetry and reflective and devotional nonfiction and for the past several years, has written daily devotionals based on the Daily Office readings for a Yahoo group.

## PIZZA PARTY!!

The first Reading Club meeting in January has become the traditional 'Frog Gigging Day.' Throughout the year, these energetic fourth and fifth graders come barreling into Hosea Hall every-other Wednesday after school, looking for a snack and a fun time improving their reading skills. One program that is used is 'Great Leaps,' a program of timed readings of phonics, phrases and stories.



This program requires one-on-one work with the kids and is perfect for The Reading Club. Completion of each goal earns the reader a paper frog in a paper pond. Once the group earns 50 frogs, it's pizza time with soft drinks and ice cream (well beyond the healthier snacks which are the usual fare). Students are usually limited to one frog per session as they continually strive forward but when it is 'Frog Gigging Day,' they can read any story and any number of stories for as many frogs as time permits. The pond was filled to overflowing and in fact, exhausted our supply of frogs (83 frogs, to be exact!). It was a great start to the new year for both the all-volunteer staff as well as the students.

## The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

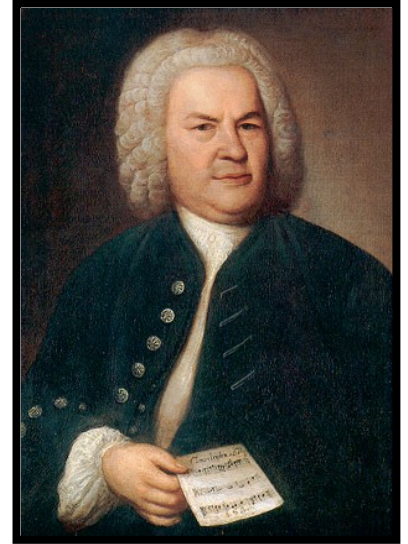
The music of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) is the bedrock of the organist's repertoire, for it is with Bach that many of the musical forms for the keyboard reached their high stage of development. Yet, we organists often forget that music for the organ represents only a small part of Bach's compositional output,

and that is just among the work that has survived. With the exception of a brief period when he



served as the court *Kapellmeister* to the prince of Anhalt-Cöthen, Bach spent most of his life working for the church. His longest tenure was the Thomaskirche in Leipzig, where he worked from 1723 until his death. In Bach's own lifetime, he was known as an organist rather than as a composer, because composition was simply part of the job. As a young man, he travelled to hear the prominent organists of his time to learn from them, and as a mature musician, many came to hear and study with him. Upon the completion of the Silbermann organ in the Dresden Frauenkirche, Bach improvised non-stop for over an hour as part of putting the instrument through its public trial. After Bach's death, much of his musical estate was dispersed, part lost, and forgotten until Felix Mendelssohn revived the *St. Matthew Passion* at a historic performance in Leipzig in 1829. The most recent discovery is the collection of organ chorales, now known as the Neumeister Collection, found in the 1980's among the manuscripts of the composer Johann Heinrich Rinck in the Beinecke Rare Book Library at Yale University.

On Sunday, March 21, we celebrate several things; among them, the return of the sun and the official start of spring, and the birthday of J. S. Bach. His life and work are presented in the towering biographies by Philip Spitta and Albert Schweitzer, and the more accessible and recent work of Christoph Wolff.



What comes through all of Bach's music is his deep faith, regardless of whether it was written for sacred or secular purposes and in spite of regular clashes with an authority that was unable to appreciate his genius. Of the manuscripts that still exist in his own hand, at the conclusion can be found these letters: s.d.g., which stands for *Soli Deo Gloria*, to God alone the glory.

## From Father Jay Pierce

There's an old story about a priest who worked in an inner city. One evening he was walking down an alley on the way home when a young man came up behind him and poked a knife against his back.

"Give me your money," the young man said.

The priest opened his jacket to reach into his back pocket to get his wallet, exposing his clerical collar.

"Oh, I'm sorry, Father," the young man said, "I didn't see your collar. I don't want YOUR money."

Trembling from the excitement, the priest removed a couple of cigars from his shirt pocket and offered one to the young man. "Here," he said. "Have a cigar."

"Oh, no, I can't do that," the young man replied, "I gave them up for Lent."

For many of us it's easier to give up something

(smoking, lose some weight, movies, etc.) than grapple with a fundamental, often overlooked, point in the annual invitation of Lent. Much of the "I'll give them up" seems to be an attempt at self-improvement—I'll be a better person. And, it exemplifies a sense of isolation—it's all about me. But there's another dimension in God's call to repentance. It's collective, a call to all the



people. Consider this writer's thoughts:

We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven. We have been preserved, the many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power, as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too

proud to pray to God that made us. It behooves us, then to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness.
