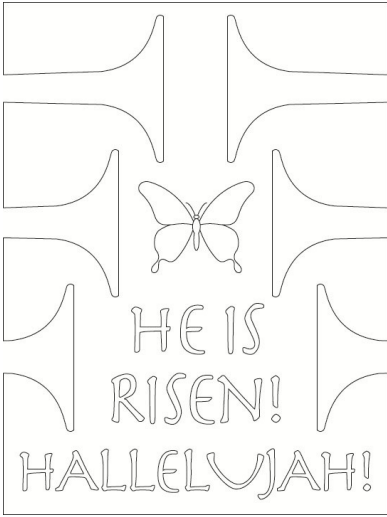

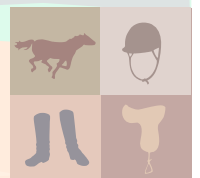

Roger Reeves, husband, father, grandfather, friend, and local businessman was a champion for children. He was devoted to working with children through *The Reading Club*. The Reading Club's mission is to help children who are reluctant and struggling readers improve their literacy skills and become more confident students. The program actively engages third and fourth graders in fun activities while developing their reading skills during a week-long summer day camp and sessions every-other week during the school year. The program is staffed by volunteers and is offered to the children free of charge. The Roger Reeves Memorial Golf Scramble was first organized three years ago to honor and commemorate Roger's life by raising money to fund this program that was dear to his heart.

"It's a fact: If children are not on track to be readers by the end of third grade, the chance of their success in school is very low."

Scramble participants will enjoy a round of golf with snacks and soft drinks followed by a delicious dinner and all are eligible for numerous door prizes. From Our Interim Rector, David Perkins

LOOKING OUT MY WINDOW, May, 2010

The windows of a house or office look out in several directions. One's point of view is limited by the size and directional focus of that window. Each month I will be sharing something of my own limited viewpoint about life at St. John's or some aspect of the Christian life and journey.

Interim ministry has been a dimension of my life and ministry since doctoral work in seminary. I served three interims in New Orleans while engaged in seminar and thesis research. Later, during a decade of Baptist seminary teaching in New Orleans I served four interims and have served three as an Episcopal priest. The last was a six-month interim in a new church plant while doing the initial people gathering for All Souls in 2002 (before we had begun Sunday worship). (All this just means I'm getting rather ancient.) During a one-year interim in The Diocese of Atlanta, I took Interim Ministry Network training; now, after eight-plus years planting a new church, the time has come for interim ministry to become the primary focus of my life.

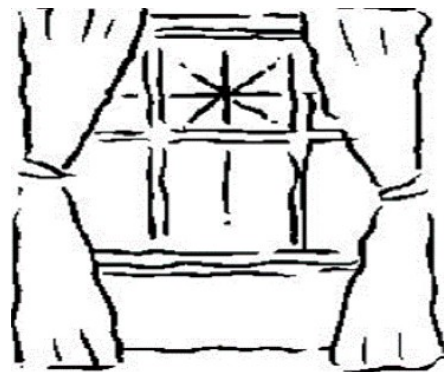
The German theologian Jürgen Moltmann wrote, "Wisdom does not spring directly from experience. It is the fruit of the reflective handling of experiences." Those years of interim ministry experience will profit me little without that reflective handling of those experiences; that will be true of my time with you at St. John's as well.

That also will be true of St. John's. The experiences of the last several years will enhance the individual and institutional wisdom of St. John's through the reflective handling of those experiences. Everything we engage in together will be designed to strengthen the worship and ministries of the church, enhance her wisdom through reflection on experience, and prepare her for the next phase of our life together. The Epistle of James promises us that if we lack wisdom, we can ask of God and God will grant it. As we reflect together, that will be our prayer, "God give us wisdom."

I'm looking forward to being with you in late April and for that first Sunday in May.

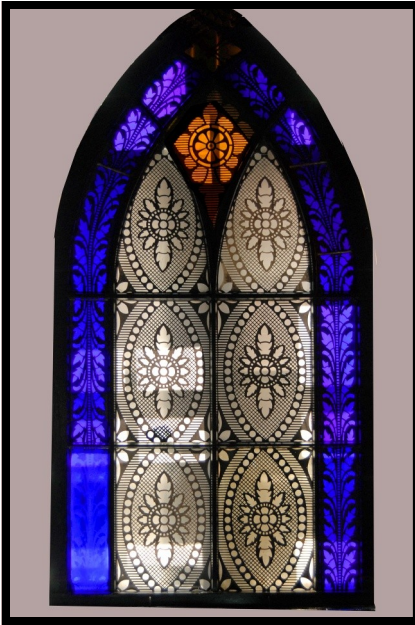

WINDOWS FROM OUR PAST



In the Rector's office and the Parish Hall and the library, you might have seen some church windows leaned up against the walls. These are some of the original windows from our church building. They had been forgotten--- under the basement steps and in the rafters of the garage. They have been restored and the cracks repaired. While they are no longer sound enough to use as exterior windows, they are an exciting find which we hope to use somewhere in the interior of our buildings.

There are two full sized 8' windows which were taken out of the main church wall along the garden when the chapel and chapel porch were added. You can still see the outline in the brick just above the chapel porch where the space was filled in and the brick does not match. There was another one where the door to the church from the chapel hall is now.

The two smaller ones, 6' high, were taken out of the narthex and replaced with more modern stained glass ones. These original ones are painted rather than having color in the glass itself. They are very beautiful and are a part of St. John's story.



Some possibilities might be to install the lower halves of the two 8' windows above the book cases in the library, or to hang the two 8' ones at the end of the office hallway, or using light boxes to illuminate from behind



(and on a dimmer), mount them all in the parish hall on the wall away from the alley with the two 8' ones in the center section and the 6' ones on either end. The House Committee is deliberating and will make their recommendation soon.

There is still one more of these windows in its original place in our building. Can you find it? (See Page 14)

The picture above, right, is a very old photograph of the nave of our church before the chapel and addition were built. On the far right of the picture, visible mainly as a vertical line of light, you can see one of the 8' windows in its original place.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

The three most important festivals of the Church in the liturgical year are Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost. Of the three, my favorite one is Pentecost, and it is unfortunate that it is overlooked because, being the “birthday” of the Church, it is the most important. The problem with Pentecost is that it moves between late May and



early June, since it falls 50 days after Easter, and it seems to get sidelined by the Memorial Day holiday as well as the panoply of end-of-school-year events when we start thinking about summer vacation. Pentecost for me is the most colorful of occasions, with the emphasis on red, yellow, orange, and white. The music is also uniquely stirring with its emphasis on the coming of the Spirit and the call to take the gospel to the rest of the world. Some of my most favorite hymns are special to

this day, such as the Pentecost verses for “Hail thee, festival day,” and that staple of Pentecost hymnody, “Come down, O Love divine” so wonderfully set by Ralph Vaughan Williams. Over the course of my life of making music in the church, there have been many anthems that have made the occasion very special.

With its emphasis on the call of the Spirit, Pentecost is also an annual call to renew ourselves and our work within our church life. Because I spend the summer months and the choir recess planning the next choir year, Pentecost for me marks the beginning of taking stock of the music program and considering what might be done differently, or exploring new ideas and directions. This is how I grow and how we all must grow. Otherwise, we become complacent and we stop growing or creating. To me, the Spirit is a creative force as much as anything else. The Spirit is what drives us and motivates to do something challenging or to change something in our lives or take on something new. This is also what I find inspiring about the opportunity for new ministry to come into this congregation, because through it we are renewed to continue the call to serve this community.

Paul urges fellow Christians to welcome one another as Christ had welcomed them. He challenged the early believers to “pursue” hospitality. In fact, hospitality was a qualification for

leadership in the early Christian communities.

Three years ago, on the Day of Pentecost, you welcomed Garland and me at St. John's. You did such a good job that we not only felt at home, but we became family. When I came to help Alan, he and I talked about a three year commitment and this month marks that date. I have decided to stay at St. John's until August 8th to help Fr. David as he gets to know you. We welcome him in this transition; one that is filled with thanksgiving and deep love.

We know that people often seek the church and a deeper relationship to God during times of transition, sometimes positive, but often negative. Visitors and members alike often behave in ways that look aloof or standing back. They may feel marked by their transition and lost in their self con-

fidence. It may be difficult to make an initial contact with another person. That's where we come in! Let us be intentional and attentive when we have a visitor in our midst. If we catch them quietly slipping out the door or standing alone with hope on their faces, or the only person or couple at a table for breakfast, let us be Christ's welcome. We often become awkward during life's transitions. We cry for help, but from a distance. It takes keen ears to hear those cries and keen eyes to see the need. Henri Nouwen says that the greatest way to care for one another is simply to pay attention.

There is no way to express how grateful Gar-

4. FOLLOW THE GARDEN PLAN

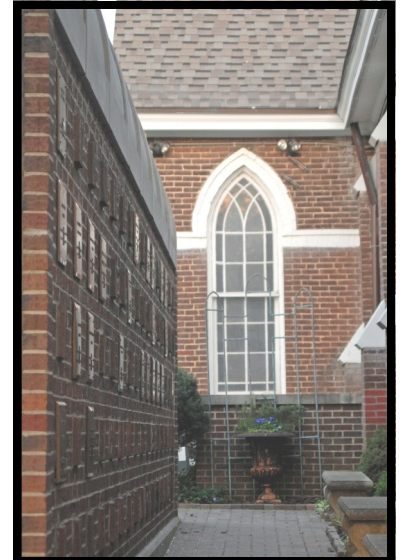

With a church the age of St. John's (organized in 1847), there are many interesting stories of our past. A sage of our church has agreed to share some of these stories. Perhaps you have a story . . . send it in! (Some stories may also have more than one version.)

There wasn't always a bell in the bell tower of our church, and therein lies a tale! One of our more colorful parishioners often bemoaned the lack of bell in the tower, but the Vestry kept finding more important things to do with the budget, so he decided that he would "enlist" his regular Friday night poker buddies to "donate" a hand or two to the Bell Fund, which he would oversee. Those Friday nights involved players from many other churches in town. Periodically, our hero would announce, "This pot's for the Bell" and gather up whatever money was on the table (too bad if you had won!). Eventually, enough money was collected (and, yes, the Vestry did help), and the bell was purchased and installed. Whenever it peals or tolls, I like to think of all those Baptist, Presbyterian, Methodist, Church of Christ, Roman Catholic dollar bills (or higher?) that went into its purchase: ecumenical anonymity!



How many Episcopalians does it take . . .

to produce Eagle Wings? Many! There are four to five regular 'columnists,' numerous parishioners who send in announcements, three to four (and not always the same three or four) photographers who share their work, six (yes, it takes that many!) proofreaders, and one editor.
