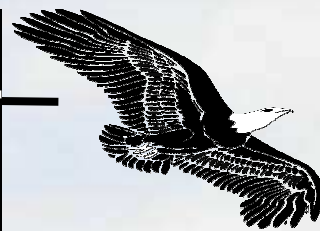

## Interim Process Update from Fr. David:

### Holy Conversations

A diocesan team will be with us on the dates listed below to lead St. Johns' in four Holy Conversations. These conversations will provide invaluable self-study information to our Nominating Committee as they prepare to receive names and engage in the search for a rector for St. Johns.

You will be invited by the Nominating Committee to attend all four of these events. Please make attending a high priority. What you have to share will be crucial to the success of these conversations.

Because the meeting time is early, a light supper will be provided. The four conversations' dates and themes are (Note that the second conversation is on a Tuesday, not a Wednesday):

**Wednesday, November 10, 6 PM -**

#### **Holy Conversation #1: "The Things I Value..."**

The team leader introduces the idea of being people of The Story—Table groups answer questions regarding the experiences that have been most important to them in their parish, including contributions they have made to the parish.

**Tuesday, November 16, 6 PM -**

#### **Holy Conversation #2: "When I Have Been Hurt, Disappointed or Angry ..."**

Following a brief presentation about hurts, disappointments, and grief, table groups engage in an exercise and report to the larger group. Then, everyone moves to the sanctuary for the Liturgy of Healing and Reconciliation, led by Bishop Sauls.

**Wednesday, December 1, 6 PM -**

#### **Holy Conversation #3: "When my safe place changes: looking across the bridge to God's future for..."**

This session deals with how participants have experienced change in the past, particularly in their parish, before turning to visioning for the future, and having an opportunity to express wishes, hopes and dreams, and things they specifically and individually are willing to do to make those hopes and dreams come true.

## Community Dinner Outreach

You may have heard about our Community Dinners on the first Monday of every month; but if you have not signed up yet, you are missing a great opportunity to work with others that are in need and to fellowship with other parishioners that work in the kitchen. The community dinners are prepared by members of St. John's Church on the first Monday of every month at the Woodford Christian Church in Versailles. The commitment is about 3 hours of your time every other month and no previous experience is needed. If you can drive a car or assist in cooking or wash a few dishes; you can join us in this joyful and fun outreach effort. We serve the same menu every month: spaghetti with sauce, tossed salad, garlic bread and dessert with iced tea, water or coffee. It is a simple meal that the participants always enjoy.

We serve anyone that is in need of a meal in the church fellowship hall and deliver to several elderly and individuals that are unable to come to the church. In all we cook for about 100 to 110 folks every month. We are quickly approaching the winter months and will need more volunteers to meet the need since our numbers tend to increase due to high heating bills or seasonal employment that affects the financial status of many of those we see. We currently have a group of 8 dedicated volunteers that have given graciously of their time every month for over a year now and we would like to start having 2 teams of volunteers to help with the dinners. We have 2 shifts for the dinner. The cooking/setup shift from 3-5:45 PM and the delivery/cleanup crew from 5-7 PM. The tasks are simple and the rewards of doing it are abundant. Ask anyone that does it! If you are interested in joining us (we need at least 8 more people), please talk with Linda Reeves or Cindy Sullivan or you can email us. ### **Looking Out My Window, November 2010**

November will be a busy month at St. John's. We will celebrate All Saints Day on Sunday, November 7 with a choral high mass at in the 9 AM service and prayers for the departed in all services. We are electing vestry members and holding the annual meeting on Sunday, November 14. Our annual stewardship emphasis, on the theme Strengthening Our Roots, will begin Sunday, October 31 and conclude on Sunday, November 21. On that Sunday, we will celebrate the Kirkin' of the Tartans. And, Tuesday, November 23, we will join with other area churches in a community Thanksgiving service (details to be announced soon).

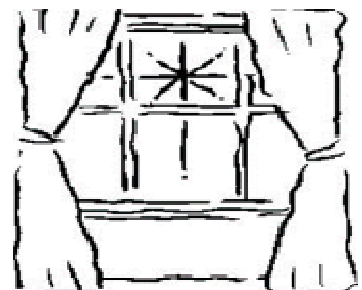
Also, we will continue the self-study, begun with the time line exercise, by engaging in four Holy Conversations, beginning Wednesday, November 10 and concluding, Wednesday, December 8 (the schedule includes a break for Thanksgiving week). Bishop Sauls will be with us for the second conversation (Tuesday, November 16) and lead a Eucharistic liturgy of healing and reconciliation.

We also have begun another initiative by creating a Newcomer Team. In November we will be recruiting and training greeters. Those people will be at the entrances each Sunday at 9 and 11:15 AM worship to welcome newcomers and assist in orienting them to St. John's and introducing them to others in attendance.

As rector during the interim period, I am growing increasingly fond of you as a people and experiencing deep joy in being among you. Thank you for your prayers, your affirmation, and your cooperative spirit. Please make attendance at the Holy Conversations a high priority (see the details of the schedule elsewhere in this newsletter). And, please pray about your commitment of time and talents and your financial commitment during the Strengthening the Roots stewardship emphasis.

## The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

Arriving at the month of November has multiple meanings for me in my life in the church. The month begins with All Saints', when we remember all those who have died, particularly in the past year, and the month ends with Thanksgiving and the beginning of a new liturgical year with Advent. It is truly a time of mixed emotions.

The celebration of All Saints' is one of my favorite holidays of the church year. This important feast of the church has its own set of unique hymns that we only get to sing once a year, so I always look for-



ward to that. I recall family and friends who are no longer living and celebrate the impact they have made on my life and who I am today. I sometimes wonder, too, about people who have come in and

out of my life, and although they are still living, but for various reasons I no longer see them and have little contact. I think we can extend that celebration to the living who have made a difference.

Towards the end of the month, we come to Thanksgiving. I am constantly reminded how truly lucky I am, particularly at St. John's. I have a choir of happy people who do a pretty good job every week. Many hours of preparation go into a single Sunday morning service, even the five-minute spot of Offertory. I am thankful for the character of our congregation and the leadership that we have. I am further reminded when we go to share our talents with others just how well we have it. I get to play a *real* organ, regardless of the limitations it has; I would much rather have naturally produced tone than something artificial coming out of a speaker. I get to worship in a space that inspires.

And then we come to the first Advent Sunday. Happy New (liturgical) Year! Then the countdown to Christmas begins as we follow the path of watching and waiting for the birth of Christ. Marcel Dupré, one of the great French organist-composers of the twentieth century, composed in the 1920's a work entitled "Passion-Symphony." The first movement is called "The world awaits the savior," and the rhythmic drive is one of impatience and expectation, which illustrates the atmosphere of the Advent season.

### All Saints Sunday - All Services

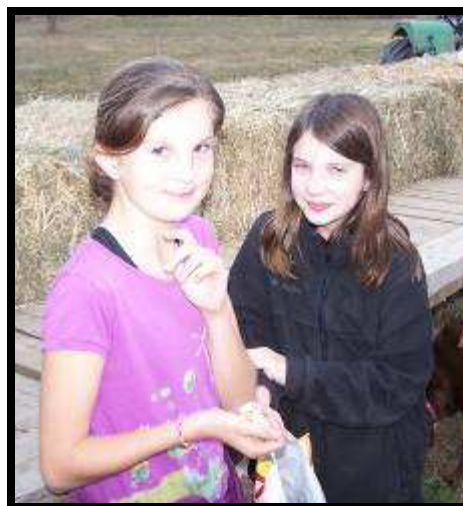

## Bazaar Bake Sale

The bake sale will be on your right, next to the coffee pot when you enter Hosea Hall. We encourage you to bake some of your special cookies, brownies, cakes, cheese cake, pies, tarts, rolls and breads. This list could go on...

Non bakers may want to make some other treat. Shoppers in the past have taken home Chex mix and other snack mix. **Candy dipped pretzels**, fudge, divinity, jams, jellies and homemade pickles and vinegars.

I encourage everyone to make a batch of signature chocolate chip cookies for the sale and to enter in the **chocolate chip cookie contest**. All chocolate chip cookies received between 8 and 9:00AM. will be tasted. I have a trophy for this year's best. These are the most asked for cookies

*Get your baking powder, baking soda, yeast, vanilla, sugar, flour and butter out then warm up the oven ...*

Lots of things at the bazaar will be bargain priced. The bake sale is not the day old bread store. I suggest pricing your bagged or wrapped goodies at about 2 or 3 times the cost of the ingredients. Put enough in a package to come out at even dollars. For example; put 2 big cookies or 4 small cookies in a bag for a dollar. A dozen might be \$3 or \$4. Fudge or pull candy at least \$8 a pound, Cakes and pies are worth at least \$1 a serving. (some cakes and pies may be sliced and sold as individual servings for the soup and sandwich lunch crowd) If you only charge what ingredients cost, we would be just as well off not baking and dropping the cost of ingredients in the cash box.

We will have the coffee pot on for \$1 for the big green cup with free refills.

Someone will be in Hosea Hall Friday night, if you have things ready. Or bring them in Saturday morning. I'll be at the bazaar bake sale table beginning about 8 am. Leftovers will be available Sunday before and after the annual meeting.

## Used Toys & Togs Drive

While cleaning out your closets, and toy boxes, to make room for new items at Christmas please remember John & Teresa Range's Used Toy Drive for the McCreary County Kids. These children appreciate everything! However, please be respectful and do not send broken or dirty items.

The children also look for gifts for their siblings and parents for Christmas that they can't otherwise afford. Even some of their parents sift through the donated items. So we'll take any school age clothes, K- 12, and ALL toys & games, and any religious items, such as prints, pictures, books, or whatnots. I know the clothing or food banks don't bring up religion, but we're delivering to a church, so we do. Before allowing the children to go through the donated items, we have a little service about God's love, and give praise to His wonderful blessings, and hand out religious gift bags that include coloring books, pencils with scripture, or anything else that tells about our awesome God. So if anyone would




like to purchase items for that it would be greatly appreciated, as well.

This is our

10th anniversary, and we welcome the youth or anyone else at St. John's to join us this year. The only year we had a group from St. John's to go with us was in 1999 when Vern, who was our youth leader at that time, took the youth. Sometimes the McCreary County kids will sing or give their testimonies for us. It is such a blessing! Most of these kids live with drug or alcohol abuse, and you and I bring them a little bit of hope for a better life.
