Generational Audio-Video Project

St. John's EYC has taken on a project that involves interviewing long time members of the church. They are asking about memories and stories that are not necessarily a part of the formal "history" of St. John's. With the help of Dr. Doug Boyd at the University of Kentucky Library's Oral History department, the EYC established and trained four teams that conducted interviews every Sunday afternoon in September. Each interviewee was interviewed two times for a total of fourteen interviews in four weeks.

Besides the interviewers Eric Sandknop, Hannah Edelen, Keelin Watkins and Audrey Sandknop, each team also included an adult reviewer who took notes of the interview and later, with a copy of the interview, completed a detailed outline of what was said. Filling out each team were two "tech" members who operated the recording device and a small video camera. They included Frances and Will Werner-Wilson, Evan Sloan, Keelin Watkins and James Hawkins. All collected materials will be archived at both St. John's and the UK Library.

Aside from the obvious benefits to St. John's, those interviewed and those doing the interviews have grown in love and respect for each other. From these interviews we hope to glean some stories and observations that we can put together in a video for use at St. John's, on our web site and as a way to introduce ourselves to prospective candidates for rector.

This project will not end with this round of interviews. When we complete work with this phase, we will move to "Round Two." Be ready! Start collecting those memories, stories and pictures. Your name is on the list!

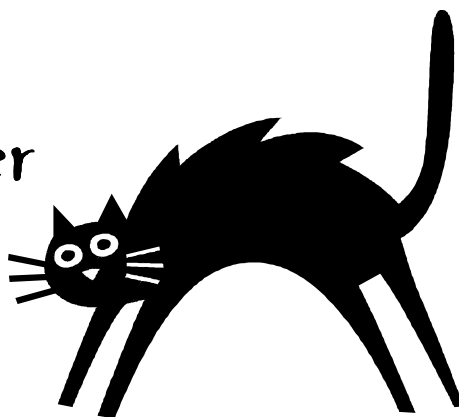

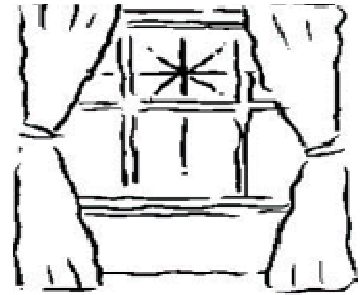

Looking Out My Window

October 2010

I often wonder what you are thinking as you approach the rail on Sunday to receive Holy Communion. Do you wonder what I am thinking? I experience an overpowering stream of consciousness during Communion; at the root of that thinking and feeling, while serving the bread, is a sentiment something like this, "The body of Christ consecrated by OUR prayer, not MY prayer"



Does that surprise you or sound strange? A question asked me in Louisiana brought this issue into focus for me as a new priest. A woman reared in the Roman Catholic tradition shared with me that a priest once criticized her after Eucharist. He saw her lips moving as she silently followed along while he offered the Great Thanksgiving; he told her that was inappropriate with words something like, "That is MY prayer as priest."

My immediate response to her was to refer her to the prayers in The Book of Common Prayer, prayers I knew were worded very much like those in the sacramentary of her church. All the pronouns, I said, are in the plural- "We, our." Her face broke into a smile, and she went away reassured that the Great Thanksgiving is the church's prayer, not just the priest's prayer.

All the prayers in both rites in The Book of Common Prayer use plural pronouns. Remember with me some of the phrases in Prayer A of Rite 2: "Therefore, WE praise you . . ."; "You made US for yourself . . ."; "WE proclaim the mystery of faith . . ."; "WE celebrate the memorial of OUR redemption . . ."; "WE offer you these gifts . . ."; "All this WE ask through your Son Jesus Christ. . . ." (Capitalization of pronouns is mine for emphasis.)



When you receive the bread and hear the words "The body of Christ, the bread of heaven," remember that you are not a passive spectator. The priest has given voice to the common prayer of the people. In response to your prayers, joined with the common prayer of the whole church, Christ has come and made holy the bread and wine with his presence, and you as well.

If I see your lips moving silently during the Great Thanksgiving, my heart will be glad, because you will be joining in a prayer offered by all of us.

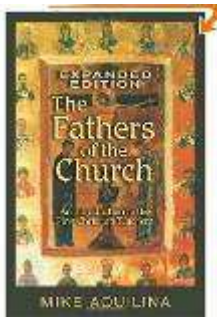
5:30 – Service of Healing and Holy Eucharist

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

It was twenty years ago that I embarked on a phase of life that would be formative in many ways. In the fall of 1990, I went to live in Germany for a year to study at the Friedrich Wilhelm University of Bonn. After my first month, in which I was absorbed in an intensive 4-week German language class, I finally had the time to begin to notice my surroundings. At that time, Bonn was still the capital of the Federal Republic of Germany, and so there was a diverse community and a wide array of cultural offerings. It was in October of 1990 that I discovered the Church of St. Boniface, which was basically the British Embassy chapel of the Church of England and belonged to the Diocese of Gibraltar. It not only served the British community, but also Commonwealth member states around the world and a handful of Americans, who were Episcopalian like myself. It wasn't long before I was dragooned into the British Embassy choir, which sang for the church services for most, but not all Sundays. Choir practice was something that I really looked forward to each week. The rehearsals were held in an assembly room of the British Embassy. As the clubroom of the embassy was located right next door, we often ended the evening there following rehearsal. Some of the members did not wait for adjournment, but rather brought a pint or two in with them. It goes without saying that re-



hearsals were always pretty jolly. Sometimes after closing the clubroom, we moved on to another pub in Bonn and closed that one, too.

This choir was also a testament to how music brings a wide array of people together. Most of the members were British, but there were also Canadians and some Germans who were looking for opportunities to use their English language skills. I have a commemorative t-shirt that a choir member designed, with the statement "Voices from Around the World" prominently displayed. The music we sang was not always the greatest and the quality was inconsistent, but the coming together was simply the best part. To be truthful, there were a few personalities as there are in every choir, but we also just enjoyed being all together for a couple hours each week. A particularly proud moment came for me when we were invited to perform for the

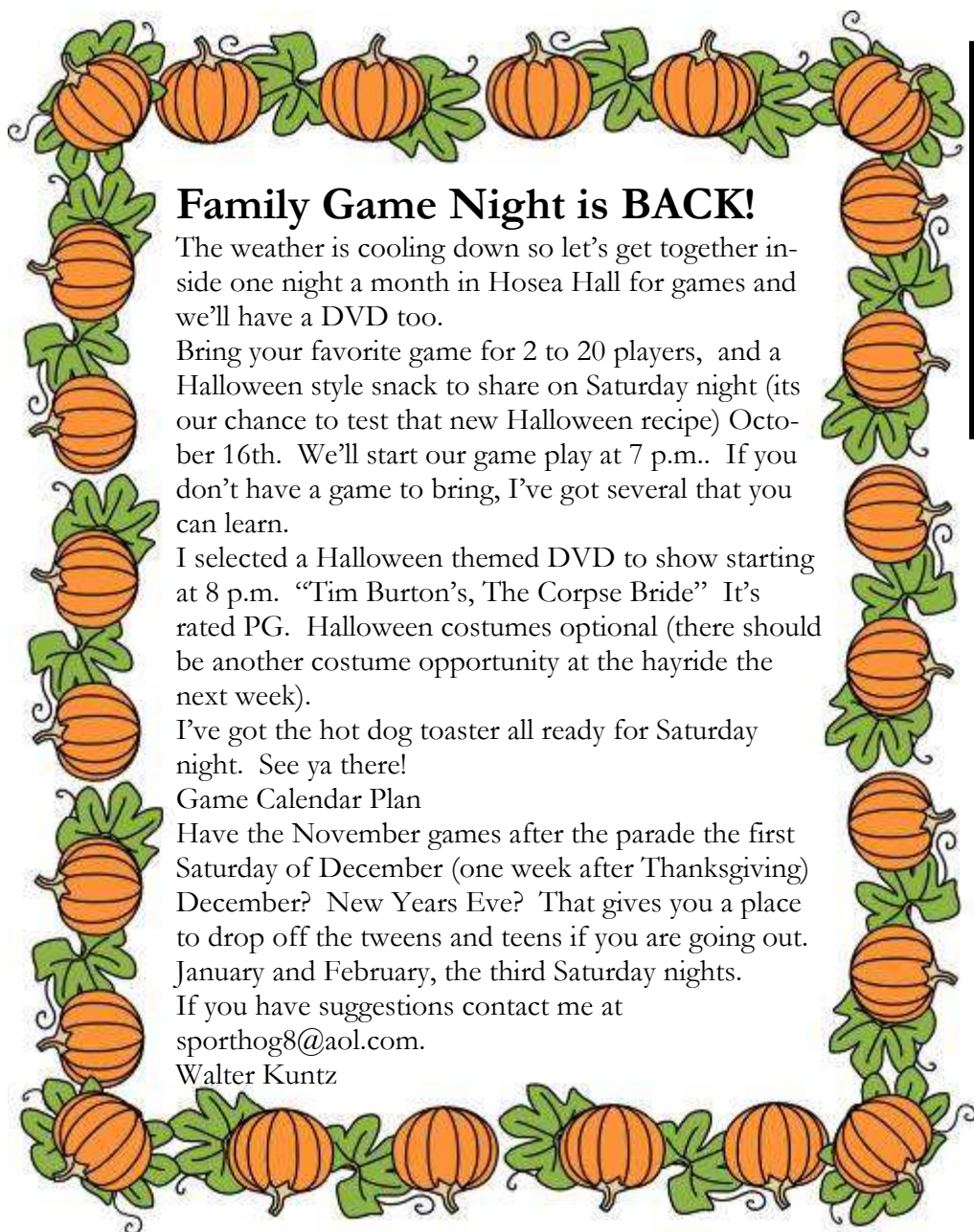
