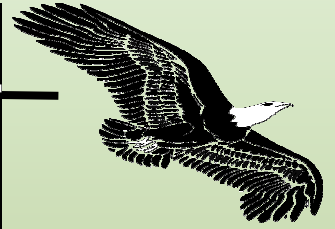

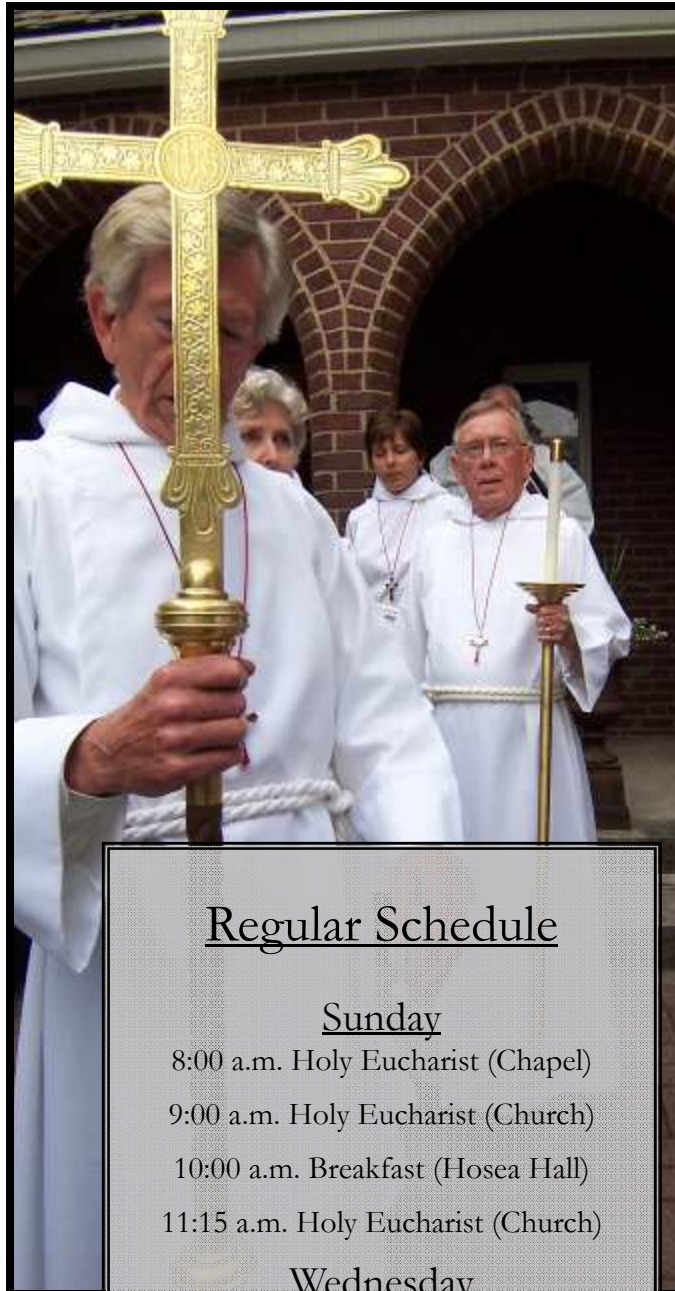
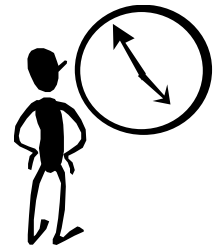

We’re starting a new curriculum in the Bible Quest class – Weaving God’s Promises. The curriculum was developed and written exclusively for the Episcopal Church. The program is titled Weaving God’s Promises after the process of faith formation in which we learn how God’s promises of salvation are inextricably woven into our lives. The program follows a three-year cycle with the following themes: Weaving Our Faith, Weaving Together the Family of God, and Weaving God’s Beloved Community. Weaving God’s Promises teaches children the way of Christ, not only in the church but also in the world, and gives them a solid grounding for future youth formation programs, which in turn prepares them for Christian adulthood. Weaving God’s Promises foster the spiritual formation and growth of our children in Christ’s love and mercy, teaches the spirit of forgiveness and reconciliation, and sends our children out into the world as Christ’s ambassadors.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

One of my favorite hymns from *Wonder, Love & Praise*, which is the green softcover book in the pew, is number 746, "God the sculptor of the mountains." I often dwell on the theme of creation, because I never cease to be amazed by it. The first verse of this hymn, written by John Thornburg and stirringly set to music by Gerre Hancock (for many years organist-choirmaster of St. Thomas, Fifth Ave., NYC), talks about the process of the shaping of the land. It is a very long process, and right around here in central Kentucky we can see features that have reached their present beauty over hundreds of thousands of years. The closing of that verse acknowledges that "we are formless; shape us now." Regardless of where we are in our spiritual journeys, we undergo a constant shaping. Sometimes it is so gradual, we may not even be aware of it, but sometimes an earthquake happens to bring about a sudden and dramatic change in our lives. When I sing the third verse, "God the unexpected infant, God the calm, determined youth," I often think of my student workers at Transylvania. So many of them come in with a lot of growing up yet to do, but their lack of maturity can sometimes add to the fun of the place. By the time they



reach graduation, they look much more like adults, calmly staring into a future full of uncertainties where life will take them.

Something that I have now grown accustomed to is that life is about constant change. We can take nothing for granted as permanent, but by embracing change we can emerge stronger, whether physically, spiritually, or both. As a church musician, I have been shaped by many experiences which make me what I am at this particular moment. To me, not taking a fresh look or not exploring a new way would be to stop growing. It is just the same with my bike rides, which I need to vary from time to time to keep rides interesting or even get out maps and explore some new places to ride. We are also entering a season of change, as the lush green that we have known for some months begins to die off in order that rebirth and new growth may occur later on. And, we are starting a new chapter in the life of our church. Yes, some things in our life will remain the same or be without any discernible change, but we are constantly being shaped, just as God sculpts the mountains and mills the sand.

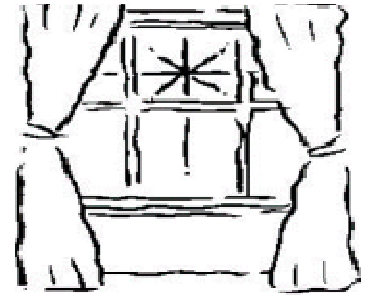

Looking Out My Window September 2010

Have you ever thought of yourself as a minister of Christ? Normally, we think of clergy in that way because they are so visible on Sundays as worship leaders and because we call on their ministry in weddings, funerals, baptisms, and moments of crisis. The Outline of the Faith (Catechism) in The Book of Common Prayer asks the question, "Who are the ministers of the Church?" The answer: "The ministers of the Church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons." (BCP, 855). The next question? "What is the ministry of the laity?" The answer: "The ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church, to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world, and to take their place in the life, worship and governance of the Church." (BCP, 855). Pentecost Sunday and the season of Pentecost (lasting until Advent) focus on the ministry of all Christians. The Holy Spirit empowers and enables each of us for our particular ministry in our unique areas of living, working, and playing. During the period between permanent rectors, the church can rediscover its spiritual independence, that its nature is not defined by the ministry or personality of a particular rector. This is an opportune moment for each parishioner at St. John's to renew their commitment to their particular ministry. I hope that you will ask this question, "What is my ministry?" However daunting the answer may feel, I hope you will dare to pray for boldness and strength to begin doing your own personal expression of ministry described above in The Outline of the Faith.

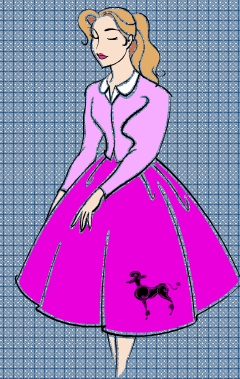
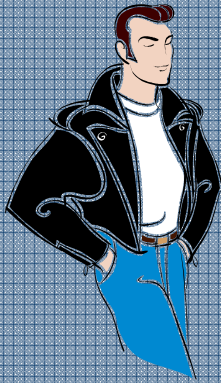
We hope that you had fun at Reading Club Camp and are enjoying your new reading

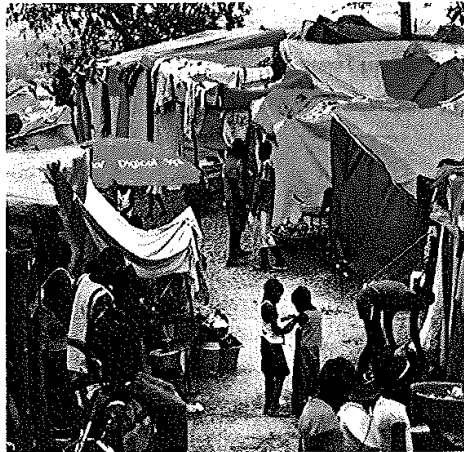

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, for hundreds of thousands of Haitians left homeless from January's earthquake, "home sweet home" is a flimsy tent.

In addition to the 1700+ tractor-trailer loads of food, medical supplies, water, pharmaceuticals, building materials and other needed goods, **Food For The Poor has announced an aggressive goal to build more than 5,000 houses in Haiti this year** as part of its long-term recovery plan that includes building schools and clinics. Construction of new structurally reinforced two room homes is under way. As of the 15th of June almost a thousand have been completed.

Imagine scrambling for food and water and shelter in the hot sun and drenching rain these people have endured since the earthquake. There are increasing reports of cholera, malaria and typhoid. And, if this isn't enough—the hurricane season is imminent.

I beg the congregation of St. St. John Episcopal Church to build at least 1 permanent home and latrine (\$3,100.00) for these miserable people to confirm our Lord's presence and concern for them, and provide a new beginning of life and joy.
