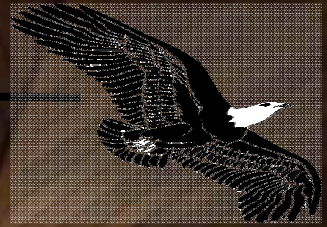

Interim Process Update

During the past month while our opening for a new rector at St. John's was posted on the Church Deployment Office and the Office of Transition Ministry web sites, the Nominating Committee has been engaged in multiple tasks in preparation for the interview stage of our search. Chief among these tasks was developing questions to ask individual candidates which would reflect the hopes, desires, and preferences of our parishioners as gleaned from our Holy Conversations. Simultaneously, we have been preparing what the transition specialists refer to as a living portfolio which is simply a brochure which contains information about the local community (including significant Lexington features such as the University of Kentucky, the Kentucky Horse Park, and Keeneland). But the emphasis is on the Versailles/Woodford County area including schools, medical care, the library, public utilities, Midway college, etc. These living portfolios will be provided to all candidates who are interviewed. Once the initial screening of candidates is completed at the Diocesan level and the most promising candidates are referred to the Nominating Committee, initial interviews will be conducted by telephone before candidates are invited to Versailles for an on-site interview. If the number of candidates who have expressed an interest to the Diocesan Office of Transition Ministries is any indication, our opening appears to be attractive to a wide range of candidates. Again, we ask for your continuing prayers and support throughout this entire process which is so vitally important to the future of St John's.

Looking Out My Window, April 2011

The week of April 17-24 will bring us to the central observances of the Christian year, the observance of Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. On Palm Sunday, we will remember Jesus' entry in Jerusalem the week before his crucifixion by reenacting the entry itself. We will gather outside (inside if it's raining), bless palm branches; and, with each of us bearing our palm branch, we will process into the church.

On Monday and Tuesday evenings, we will celebrate Holy Eucharist in the chapel. (See the schedule elsewhere in the newsletter for exact times and locations for each service.)

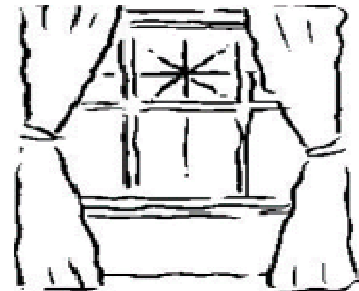
On Wednesday, we will gather in the chapel for Tenebrae (means darkness). This unique service of readings and the extinguishing of candles prepares us for the events of Jesus' betrayal, arrest, trial, death, and resurrection.

The services of Thursday-Saturday actually are treated as one observance stretching over three days (Latin Triduum)

Maundy Thursday - Jesus' last night with his followers. He instituted Holy Eucharist on this night and washed his followers' feet. We will reenact the foot washing, celebrate Eucharist, and strip the altar. We will establish a Garden of Repose in the chapel with materials for meditation and prayer and invite you to come in one-hour intervals throughout the night to keep vigil with Christ.

Good Friday - On the day of Jesus' death, we will venerate the cross, read the passion Gospel, and receive Holy Communion from Reserved Sacrament.

Holy Saturday - Three events take place. In the morning, we will observe Stations of the Cross. That afternoon, children will enjoy an Easter Egg Hunt and we will flower the cross. At dusk, we will celebrate the Service of Light outside and then process in for the Great Vigil of Easter.



Easter Day - We will celebrate Holy Eucharist at the normal times.

These liturgies represent more than symbolic recollections. Rather, through these observances, we remember that we were present in these events in the person of the Apostles and others whose witness has brought us to faith. What happened to Christ also happens to us. We share his death and his resurrection in Holy Baptism and in our ongoing experience of salvation.

As your priest, I wish that each of you would attend all of these services. The liturgies offer us powerful tools for the formation of our children and ourselves. If I had to choose between Easter Sunday and the Saturday vigil, I would attend the Vigil, a service for which our written sources extend as far back as the fourth century.

May this Easter observance bring us a fresh experience of the power of Christ's resurrection.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

Sometimes I find waiting for Easter is more difficult than Christmas, and it seems to be compounded this year. Spring has arrived a little earlier, and the flowers and the burst of fresh green leaves generally associated with the timing of Easter have already begun to appear. Here at the beginning of the month, we are only half way through the Lenten season. Epiphany was so long, it was joked about on the Church Pension Fund calendar in the church office, and even some of my colleagues were starting to comment that it was getting difficult to figure out what to play that was seasonally appropriate. All the



signs of new life are present, but we are just not there yet. In the Orthodox tradition, Easter is a season of gift-giving, most dramatically evidenced by the jeweled Easter eggs crafted by Carl Faberge that were given among the member of the Russian imperial family. Had we the same tradition,

what a sense of heightened expectation we would have.

One of the challenges of being a church musician at this time of year is meeting the particular expectations of Easter. Because of a combination of childhood memories and remembering loved ones who are no longer with us, there are particular hymns that we just simply have to have, no matter what. Actually, I find myself looking forward to the arrival of Easter for much of the same reasons, and just like the Faberge Easter eggs, there are going to be some surprises. But, . . . we have to wait a bit first. We have yet to complete our Lenten journey, and part of that for me seems to be a process of saying good bye. Allison Asay's last Sunday with us will be Palm Sunday. We have seen her grow from a first-year college student into a confident young woman, and her talent and enthusiasm will be much missed. The search for the new rector is coming along, and I know that during this year the interim will conclude. We have already said farewell to Keila Thomas, and it feels like the team that has developed over the past year is going away. What I must look forward to, just as the approach of Easter with the theme of new life, is the arrival of new people and the formation of a new ministerial team, which will present new and exciting possibilities in our worship life together.

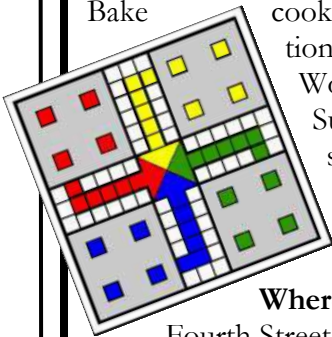
