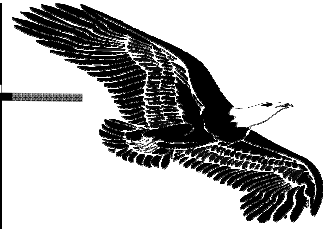

Interim Process Update

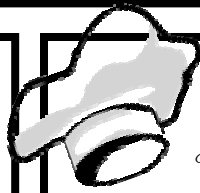
The Nominating Committee has made rapid progress during the past several weeks. Our goals and challenges, which were derived from parishioner input during the Holy Conversations, have been approved both at the Vestry and at the Diocesan levels. These goals and challenges subsequently have been included in a brochure which contains a broad overview of St. John's, including both our history and our parish life today. This brochure will help define our opening to prospective candidates and, consequently, serve as a recruiting tool for us.

While probably the majority of candidates for our opening will respond via the Church Deployment Office posting, it is important that parishioners at St. John's have a means of recommending candidates whom they deem qualified as well. Therefore, Nomination Forms will be placed in Hosea Hall for the purpose of recommending qualified candidates. The recommended individual must sign the form authorizing his/her name to be submitted for consideration. (Not having the approval of the person being recommended could lead to a very awkward and time-consuming situation!)

As we approach the actual screening and interviewing phase of our search, parishioners are encouraged to contact any member of the Nominating Committee- Gayle Box, Debby Edelen, Ann Miller, Ron Mobley, Vickie Duff, Ann Richmond, Linda Reeves, Julie Ross, Sarah Sandknop, and Ned Meekins- with any questions or suggestions. And the continued prayers and support of the parish become even more important as we progress.

Looking Out My Window, March 2011

March 9 marks the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday observances. We will gather at 7:30 AM and noon in the chapel and at 7 PM in the church.

Lent takes us into the desert with Jesus where he wrestled with the powers of darkness and fasted and prayed (See Matthew 4 and Luke 4 and Mark 1 for the story.). To arrive at the empty tomb and celebrate Easter, we must go the way of the desert. We cannot celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death on Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter without having taken the measure of the evil that called forth God's son and because of which he suffered death.

Were we to ignore the darkness in our own lives and our complicity in the evils of our culture, we could not celebrate God's unconditional saving love and the profundity of that love. Grace becomes grace only when viewed against the backdrop of the human predicament that calls forth that grace. So, in Lent we seek a more clear vision of our need for God, our frailty, and the brokenness of our lives. We turn to God for a fresh experience of God's freeing and transforming love.

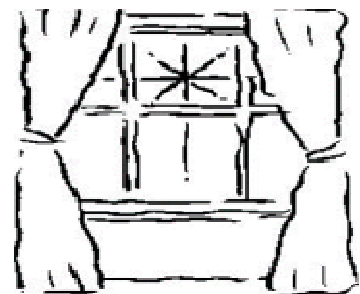
The focus often gets misplaced in Lent, covered over with a focus on what we will give up during the Lenten fast. Jesus did fast in the desert for 40 days, the precedent for our Lenten fast. And, that fasting is vital so long as we understand what we are doing. We are seeking to deprive ourselves to align our bodies more fully with the hunger for God that drives us to turn to God in repentance.

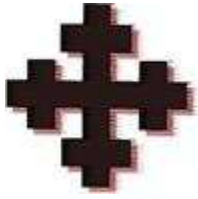
Jesus also prayed during his desert struggles, the precedent for adding spiritual practices in Lent. We are doing a Lenten study of prayer on Wednesday evenings as a way of picking up the pace during this season, a way of adding a spiritual practice. You can focus more on daily prayer and the reading of the Bible and writings on spirituality during Lent. You can add some form of service to your weekly routine.

You also can engage in the Sacramental Rite of Reconciliation. I will be in the chapel on Wednesdays during Lent at 4 PM and on Saturdays at 9 AM to welcome you for this sacramental rite.

The Ash Wednesday observance captures the themes of Lent and gives ritual expression to our human frailty and need for God. If you've not normally attended, I encourage you to do so this year.

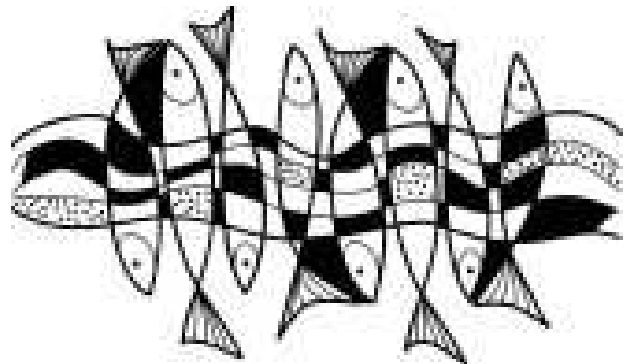

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

As a child, I always looked forward to the season of Lent, probably because I really liked the color purple. The paraments and clergy vestments were particularly rich in color, and it broke the monotony of green. In Sunday School, we were given a purple mite box to collect money during the season which would be turned in on Palm Sunday. Like so many cherished memories of the Church, this seems to be another tradition that has fallen away. I guess another reason I liked Lent so much was the timing. The beginnings of spring were evident as the weather had turned noticeably warmer, and it also meant that Easter was coming. Of course, at that age Easter meant a basket full of chocolate eggs, jelly beans and a solid chocolate bunny planted in the middle. Upon maturity, I still like the change in color, and Lent is still looking toward Easter, but for different reasons.

Lent for me is a time of reflection, and our Lenten music represents that. A couple of my favorite anthems are making the round again, like Bob Chilcott's setting of "God so loved the world" and Her-

bert Howells' "Like as the hart," which are stunning in their simplicity. Some people call it the time of "doom and gloom," but it can be whatever one wants to make of it. Some of my organist colleagues play music only in minor keys. In some places, "high church" Anglicans will sing nothing but plainsong for the next 5 weeks. I prefer to focus on things that can make me a better person rather than depriving myself of something, although sometimes removing an element from my life can lead to discovery of something wonderfully new. Just as Jesus journeyed into the wilderness for a period of time, so we all have our personal wilderness journeys and experiences, at the conclusion of which we celebrate our Easter joy. In some traditions, Easter is a gift-giving time, so even as I enter this season, there is also a sense of excitement of what is coming in a few

weeks, rather than a sense of dread and worthlessness. So, celebrate your journey, for we have something quite grand waiting at the end.

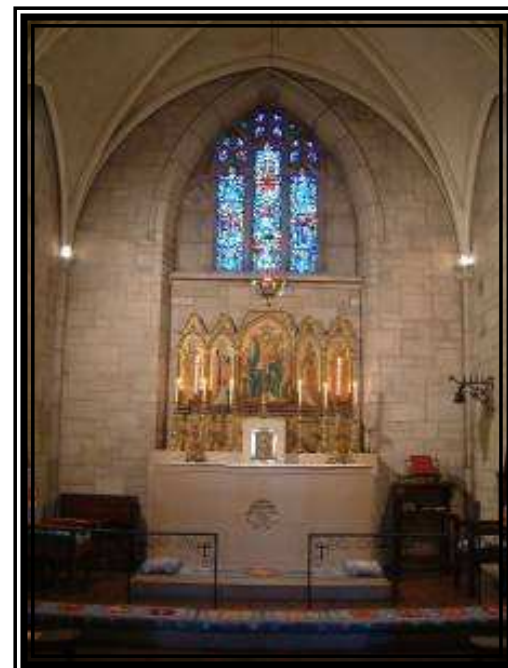
A blessed Lent to all as our world begins to awake from its dormant state, returning to life!
