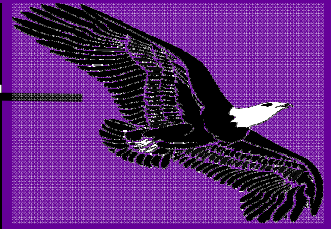

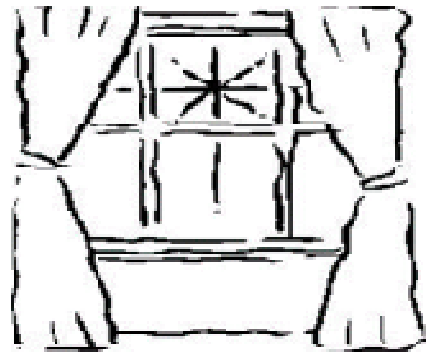
Looking Out My Window, May 2011

In her novel *The Living*, Annie Dillard describes this scene from a funeral:

“Hugh stood with stiff Lulu and supple Bert at the graveside. The Nooksacks stood together with their preacher. “Before the funeral, in mourning for his father, they had shrieked and pounded on boards...“At last big-faced Norval Tawes read Scripture and prayed. ‘O Death, where is they sting?’ Norval Tawes called out, and his little black eyes glittered on Hugh. “Hugh thought, ‘Just about everywhere, since you ask.’”

Even in the Easter season, and perhaps especially now, the preaching of resurrection brings the reality of death more clearly into focus. We all die; we experience the sting of death in thoughts of our own death as well as in the deaths of others.

Episcopal priest Robert Capon once wrote, “Jesus came to raise the dead. The only qualification for the gift of the Gospel is to be dead. You don’t have to be smart. You don’t have to be good. You don’t have to be wise. You don’t have to be wonderful. You don’t have to be anything...you just have to be dead. That’s it.”



Throughout this month, we will be celebrating Christ’s resurrection in Easter season, while we deal with the sting of death. Capon’s words remind us that becoming real about our own death opens the possibility of resurrection.

We experience death in spiritual fashion, too. Apart from a relationship with God in Christ, we do not experience God’s living presence. And, even as Christians we bring to God deadness that only Christ’s indwelling presence can address. May we in this Easter season bring those dead, lifeless areas of our inner being to Christ and ask for the touch of his risen life.

We can execute the same reality check and utter the same prayer for the life of our church. St. Johns’ experienced a resurrection after 2004 and that resurrection still is ongoing. We can identify the areas of our church’s life that seem lifeless and lacking in vitality and ask for the release of Christ’s risen life.

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

The trumpets have sounded declaring the resurrection and the Easter season has finally begun! I had written earlier in the year how in the life of the early Church, the Epiphany season ranked second only to Easter. Just like Epiphany, each Sunday in the Easter season represents a particular event between the resurrection and concluding with the final ascension of Jesus. Then, we begin the longest and final season of the church year with Pentecost Sunday. Although I really enjoy the fourth Easter Sunday with the theme of the Good Shepherd and the sixth Sunday, sometimes referred to as “Rogation,” with the theme of creation and nature, one of the more interesting Sundays in the Easter cycle for me is actually the second Sunday after Easter, with the story of “doubting” Thomas. The message is “blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.” How often do we look for something tangible to connect with the risen Christ to satisfy our need for some kind of evidence? Take a look in the hymnal at 209, “We walk by faith, and not by sight; no gracious words we hear from him who spoke as none e’er spoke; but we believe him near.” The words of Henry Alford address that slight nagging feeling of doubt.

The month of May also features some interesting commemorations. Among them is St. Augustine,

First Archbishop of Canterbury (d. 605), who brought formal Roman Christianity to England. One of his successors is also remembered in May, St. Dunstan (d. 988), who among other things, is the patron saint of fair measures of beer for the price. Yes, I said that. Overseas, it is common in restaurants and pubs to see a marking near the top of a glass, which indicates the level to which a server must pour a beverage. Apparently, this originated with Dunstan. We also remember the Venerable Bede, author of the first history of the English church and people. Of particular importance to me is Dame Julian of Norwich, whom we remember on May 8. A medieval English mystic, she is the author of a collection of treatises entitled “Revelations of Divine Love.” It was while visiting Julian’s cell in Norwich, England, that Joanna came to the conclusion to marry me, and in honor of that we were married on May 8, and this year will be our 15th anniversary. The Easter season truly gives us a lot to celebrate!
